Reception Learning (Attenborough and Luther-King)

Reception have had a busy week of sorting lots of different objects into sets in our Maths lessons. We have been thinking about the different ways we can sort objects such as by colour, shape, and size. We have been using the words 'same' and 'different' to describe the sets we have made- all whilst having lots of fun trying to guess how our teachers have sorted objects too!

In EAD on Tuesday afternoon and to tie in with our RE (Religious Education) theme this week of 'belonging', we started work on our self-portraits and got extremely excited to test out the paints out for the first time! We will put our finished portraits up in our classrooms to show we belong to Attenborough and Luther-King classes. Our teachers think there may be lots of future Picasso's amongst us!





Year 1 Learning (Armstrong)

This week in maths we have finished our work on place value. We have done lots of counting forwards and backwards from different numbers, saying one more and one less than a given number and using a number line to help us. In English we have started working on our new book *We're All Wonders*. We have made lots of predictions about what might happen in the story before we got the chance to do some hot seating and drama. Later in the week we did some writing, focusing on basic sentences with full stops, capital letters and finger spaces. We finished our geography learning and started doing some art based on the work of Bridget Reilley.

Year 1 and 2 Learning (Chanel)

Year 1 have been busy in Maths this week comparing objects and numbers. We have learnt new vocabulary 'greater than, less than and equal to' and have even been using Mathematical symbols to represent this! Year 2 have been deepening their estimation skills to place given numbers on a number line and have gone on to practice counting in 2s, 3s and even 5s. In English, we started our learning on our new book 'We Are All Wonders'. We used Drama to familiarise ourselves with the characters and story line by creating freeze frames. Over the next few weeks, we are going to be writing a letter from 'Auggie', the main character in the book, so to support this we investigated the purpose and features of different letters

<u>Year 3 Learning (Yousafzai)</u>

In year 3 this week we have finished our draft of our first-person narrative based on the story Flat Stanley. We have enjoyed our PE lessons working on ball skills. We have continued our place value topic in maths and have been comparing and ordering 3-digit numbers. Our science learning has been exciting we have found out that there are different types of skeletons, they are called endoskeleton, hydrostatic skeleton, and exoskeleton. We identified animals with the different types of skeletons.





Year 4 Learning (Gandhi)

This week has seen us complete our Geography unit on 'Are all settlements the same?' In the last 2 lessons we have been learning about New Delhi, including some of the physical and human features that you can find there. Pupils used Google Maps on the iPads to explore the city and to locate some of the different features and landmarks that we had been looking at as a group. We then compared the capital of India to our own local area, here in Peterborough.

Year 5 Learning (Frank)

We have been focused on description in our English work this week. Looking at ways to 'paint pictures' in readers eyes with our writing. Through this week we have looked at onomatopoeia, similes, metaphors, personification, and expanded noun phrases! We will be well equipped to write descriptive writing all about WW2 London next week. Our class book is getting exciting as we get into the latter chapters, and we have been focusing in guided reading on inference – finding things in our reading from cluse from the text.

Year 6 Learning (Pankhurst)

This week, the Year 6 children have shown real maturity in a range of areas. From showing empathy and understanding in RE, to supporting one another with difficult Maths with patience and kindness. In DT we have begun looking at unit all about games and the children enjoyed their first lesson where we looked at the function and form or a range of children's toys.
