Reception Learning (Attenborough and Luther-King)

This week we learnt in the DT room for the first time... and for an exciting reason! We read Biscuit Bear by Mini Grey and made our own biscuit bears. There was no chance of our Biscuit Bears magically coming alive in the middle of the night like the one in the story, as they were too delicious not to eat straight away!! Next week we will think about the initial sounds for the equipment and ingredient names to help us write some lists. We will also be sequencing the photos of us making our Biscuit Bears chronologically.





Year 1 Learning (Armstrong)

In English this week, Armstrong class have started looking at their new book *When the Rains Come* by Tom Pow. This is a lovely folk tale from Malawi, and we also learned a little bit about Malawi so we could better understand the context of the story. We then worked together to create a class story map and script and have been practicing our story, script and actions so that we can confidently retell the story next week in our independent Big Write. In Maths this week we have been working on Number Sentences including learning all about the plus and equals signs, how to write the sentence and even how to present this carefully in our books which has led to some fantastic learning. In Art we have done some lovely work on single line drawings, and we enjoyed celebrating Ada Lovelace Day by learning a little bit about her life and designing posters about how we use technology today.

Year 1 and 2 Learning (Chanel)

Chanel class have thoroughly enjoyed working Mathematically this week. Year 1 were introduced to number sentences and had great fun using concrete resources to deepen their understanding of 'plus' and 'equals'. Year 2 applied their knowledge of tens and ones to find related facts and number bonds to 100. In English, both year groups began the new book ' When the Rains come' by Tom Pow. To provide context, we learnt all about Malawi and then went on to story map the key events.

Year 3 Learning (Yousafzai)

This week in year 3 we have continued our addition and subtraction learning where we have focused on adding 1s across a 10 and adding 10s across a hundred. We have started to read our guided reading book and have thought about what we would use a magic pencil for. We started our art topic where we were encouraged to see like an artist, this allowed us to pick out shapes that we could see within still life objects. We finished our science topic on skeletons with investigating if all skeletons are the same.

Year 4 Learning (Gandhi)

Year 4 have now completed their Computing unit on online safety. This week we looked at the following areas: What is a bot and what is my #TechTimetable like? Students particularly enjoyed producing their own bot designs, producing some good pieces of work, with detailed drawings and explanations on what their bot does, how it will benefit the class and the potential risks it may pose. They finished the topic by creating a Tech Timetable to measure their screen time on a typical school day, to assess the number of positive and negative digital distractions, in addition to ways this could be potentially improved.

Year 5 Learning (Frank)

This week we finished our 3rd person narratives and then edited our writing. We used purple pens to spot and correct punctuation, add better vocabulary, vary our sentences, and improve our spelling. We have continued to read more chapters of our class book and completing comprehension on certain parts of the story.

In DT we have begun pop-up books relating to our history topic of WW2. We are doing pop-ups, sliders, and pivots to be creative with our books. This week we celebrated Ada Lovelace day and we researched everything about her and her amazing contribution to Maths and computing.

Year 6 Learning (Pankhurst)

The Year 6 children have worked exceptionally hard this week during our first look at SATS. We are proud of the maturity they have shown and the positive attitude towards their work - we hope this continues for the rest of the year! Alongside this, we have researched the likes of Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King Jr to further develop our understanding of Black history and have produced some exceptionally high-quality work including posters, fact files and even musical performances.
