## Reception Learning (Attenborough and Luther-King)

This week we have been busy learning in our new bakery role play area to support our learning about traditional tales The Little Red Hen and The Gingerbread Man! We have been using our knowledge of making bread and biscuits to pretend to make our own baked products alongside writing shopping lists and recipe instructions. We have enjoyed using the card reader and our knowledge of numbers to pay for the items too.

#### **Year 1 Learning (Armstrong)**

In Armstrong, this week we have continued reading *Coming to England*. We have started prepping for writing our diary entries by doing some hot seating activities about Floella's journey on the boat and writing some descriptive sentences. In maths we looked more closely at the properties of 3D shapes before doing some work on repeating patterns. We also continued our unit on Algorithms and did lots of different activities based on specific instructions and getting them in the right order.


#### Year 1 and 2 Learning (Chanel)

What a super week in Chanel class! In English we looked in more detail at our class book 'Coming to England' and began planning our next 'Hot task' - a Diary entry from the perspective of Floella Benjamin. To help enrich our plan we have discussed exciting adjectives to describe the scenery in Trinidad and London. We also completed a 'Hot seating' task where we shared the thoughts and feelings Floella may have had about her journey to England. In Maths both year groups are continuing to learn all about Shape. Year 1 have focused on naming 3D shapes and identifying real life versions of these, for instance a tin of beans being a cylinder shape. Year 2 have found vertical lines of symmetry and gone on to identify the number of edges, faces and vertices different 3D shapes have. All the children have been working tirelessly to perfect their Nativity play and are extremely excited to share this with you next Thursday and Friday afternoon.

#### Year 3 Learning (Yousafzai)

This week, year 3 have started to look at newspaper articles in guided reading as this will be the first genre, we focus on in our writing lessons during the spring term. In writing we have started our explanation text; we have created our own robot to help us with chores. We are writing a step-by-step guide of how to use our robot and what it does. We have continued working on our 3-, 4- and 8-times tables in maths lessons. In history we have learnt lots about what happened during the Stone Age, Iron Age and Bronze Age. We have tried to work out what different artifacts were and learnt about what trading is. We compared houses from the Stone Age and the Iron Age. In science we have started work on rocks and looked at different rocks and explored how we can group rocks.





#### Year 4 Learning (Gandhi)

This week Year 4 have continued their reading unit on The Romans. They completed their lesson on the book's context, by looking at the timeline of the Roman Empire. This involved sorting the given events into the correct order, with a particular focus on those relating to the invasion and occupation of Britain (then known as Britannia). The comprehension lesson – titled: 'Land in Britain!' explored the initial invasion of the UK by the Romans and the Celtic people (Celts) that called the land home

## Year 5 Learning (Frank)

We have begun reading a Charles Dickens text called the Christmas Carol in English. To understand it in context, we compared Christmas in the Victorian era to a modern Christmas. Using part of the story we converted part of the story into a play using all the features of play scripts including character's speech and stage direction. We had a chance to act these short plays out using dialogue and stage direction.

## Year 6 Learning (Pankhurst)

In English, we have concluded our unit on playscripts and have started looking at explanation texts. During our reading lessons, we have looked at texts that give us information about the heart and have been able to identify key features within those. In Maths, we have rounded up our learning on Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, and the children have made us proud with the progress they have made in their arithmetic practice.
