Reception Learning (Attenborough and Luther-King)

We have been looking at patterns this week in Maths. We used compare bears, cubes, and counters to make our patterns within provision. Some of our patterns followed an ABAB pattern, others followed ABCABC patterns- tricky! Our teachers tried to trick us by making mistakes in some of the patterns that they made, but we were quick to spot those mistakes and reason how they needed correcting!





Year 1 Learning (Armstrong and Chanel)

Year 1 have been exploring colour mixing in so many interesting ways this week. We have looked at the works of Jasper Johns, Clarice Cliff and even a local Peterborough artist Jaroslaw Jacek Sokol. The children have developed their understanding of primary and secondary colours and know which colours to mix to create new colours. This week we even looked at how to create lighter and darker hues! Their work looks amazing!

Year 2 Learning (Hamilton)

We have had a lovely final week of term in Hamilton class. We applied all the skills we have been building on and wrote our story endings to the short film 'Lighthouse'. We enjoyed reading these out and hearing each other's fantastic ideas! In Maths, we have continued our work on measure. This time focusing on volume and capacity. We enjoyed using a variety of water containers to compare these.

Year 3 Learning (Yousafzai)

Year 3 this week have finished reading pebble in my pocket, we have enjoying following the journey of the pebble from 480 million years ago to today. In maths we have compared capacity and volume along with adding and subtracting with this unit of measure. We have enjoyed working through several steps to solve problems. In history we have made our own shields and understood how different Roman armies formed. We had the chance to re-enact being part of a Roman army. In PE we ended our football unit with a Champions League competition with Year 4.

Year 4 Learning (Gandhi)



This week has been full of exciting learning activities! In maths, we've been discovering how to measure perimeter and area in different polygons. During our English Reading sessions, we have been enjoying the events in "There's a Boy in the Girl's Bathroom," as we learn more about the main character, Bradley Chalkers. In our Writing lessons, we have continued to hone our persuasive writing skills and even published our work using laptops. It has been another fun week in Year 5.

Year 6 Learning (Pankhurst)

To finalise our Spring Term, the Year 6 children have completed their non-chronological report writing on different energy sources. After several week of studying energy sources in Geography, the children were able to combine this with their Year 6 writing skills to produce some lovely pieces of written work.
